Sermon on the Mount.




A Story: The most obvious part of the parable is to make the crowd think about what they are building their values, ethics and identity upon. Jesus is asking about foundations, which, though not seen offer structural integrity. Maybe you can remember being taught this story in Sunday school with a flannel graph and the singing of,

'The Wise Man Built His House Upon A Rock'. Two foundation materials are mentioned: one sandy, one rocky. However, only one is able to withstand the rain coming down, the rising streams and the winds blowing. So Jesus warns, be wise about what you build your lives upon. Foundations are important.

Next Sunday the plan was for many students and alumni of Jersey College for Girls to celebrate their 140th anniversary within St Helier Centre. It was in the vestry of Grove Place Wesleyan Chapel that their inaugural meeting took place. The British Press and Jersey Times recorded it as such:

A meeting held in the vestry of Grove Place Wesleyan Chapel, chaired by the Rev'd W. Nicolle - the result of the feeling of a group of Methodists, and their friends of other denominations, that there had long been a pressing

need in the island for a school 'to give to the daughters of residents and others, at an extremely moderate rate, an education of the highest order.'



The religious teaching was not to be contrary to recognised Methodist doctrine, but neither was it to be "a condition of (a) girl being permitted to receive general instruction in the College that she attend any religious observance and instruction to which (her) parents or guardians object."

There are elements of this educational foundation story for which Jersey

Methodists can be proud: equal educational opportunity for girls, aspiration for excellence, access irrespective of financial means, and a faith-based environment that is inviting but not demanding.

Those are strong foundations upon which to build, and I am sure that everyone would wish them well as they celebrate 140 years of education.

A Question: What do you think makes a good teacher? Perhaps you can recall someone who sparked an interest in a subject, for instance the music teacher who inspired you. John Lobb and Amy Luce did that for many. Or the history teacher who made the subject much more than dates, or the Chemistry teacher who trusted you with a Bunsen burner!

When I think back to my inspirational teachers they had more than competence and knowledge.

It was even more than enthusiasm and charismatic personality. It was their willingness to see potential within me, and believe that I could find pleasure and fulfilment in the subject-even when I was not very good at it! They somehow conveyed that they were on my side.

Jesus was just like that. Within his Galilean ministry he was often known as Rabbi - Teacher, 'and as one who had authority'. The crowds seemed to hang on his words. He illustrated from everyday life such as yeast, planting seeds, pearls and hidden treasure. Here was a teacher who made things clear by combining knowledge, wisdom and insight.

In these Covid-19 days, it must be especially demanding to be a teacher. So might you this week contact a teacher to encourage them. Sometimes a genuine, affirming enquiry can remind people of their noble profession and how they are valued as a teacher. You never know, your words, actions and prayers might just make a big difference.

Conclusion

May we all be open to new discoveries and ideas: never too old to change: lifelong learners; men and women, boys and girls of the Jersev Methodist Circuit, who are continually shaped by the living presence of Christ to find that in art and science, history and computing, dance and mathematics that there are echoes of the glory of God. It was Sir Isaac Newton who said, "Don't doubt the creator, because it is inconceivable that accidents alone could be the controller of this universe."

Or in the verse of Charles Wesley, 'Now let me gain perfection's height, now let me into nothing fall, be less that nothing in your sight, and feel that Christ is all in all.'
