# **BEACH LABYRINTHS**

The aim of a labyrinth is to build community through conversation and walking labyrinths, facilitating and enabling people to encounter a sense of well-being, peace and God.

This summer a New Places for New People initiative took place that involved engaging with individuals via beach labyrinths. Taking place down St Brelade's bay, the team setup on the beach just below the Biarittz hotel with both large labyrinths (drawn out in the sand) and small finger labyrinths (laminated A5 sheets) available for people to use.

Overall 6 sessions had been planned from June to September, unfortunately 2 did have to be cancelled due to the weather, but the team managed to set up on 4 dates; one each month from June to September.





As well as people physically using the beach labyrinths and finger labyrinths, anyone passing by who showed an interest was also given a fact sheet and finger labyrinth to take away. The team were able to strike up conversations with passers by, even if they didn't take part and across all those that were engaged with, some deeper pastoral coversations occured.



The team found that children were the most curious and if they were nearby would bring their parents/carers along to find out what was happening. It was intriguing to see 3 children who had encountered a labyrinth, later creating their own style of labyrinth nearby (pictured to the left).

The feedback from participants was very positive and for some a very meaningful and/or emotional experience with God and/or themselves took place. It was a wonderful initiative for all involved and something the team are interested in exploring further.

reflects on the various seasons of life and the divine order of time.


