Today's Reading from the New Testament: - Hebrews 12: 1-3

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. 3 Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

Time to Reflect

As we slowly regain freedoms that have been limited because of Covid-19 I hope these verses from the book of Hebrews may have a message to encourage us. The unknown author reminds his readers of faithful people who have gone before them: people like Noah, Abraham, Jacob, Moses, David and Samuel. These he describes as a 'cloud of witnesses' that were cheering on the early church as they ran their race. I'm told by those who have run a marathon that it is the support of spectators that makes all the difference-their cheers, shouts and words of encouragements lift the spirits.

So it is with our life of faith- we can be encouraged by our witnesses who have faced great challenges and vet persevered. Just as the book of Hebrews makes a list of witnesses. might you today jot down some of the names that have helped and inspired you? I wouldn't be surprised if that list contained many ordinary saints: Sunday school teachers, friends and family, local preachers, members of your church, some living- others promoted to glory. What a list! Might you remember before God in thanksgiving for all that made them special. With that list in your hand might you pause and know that they are cheering you on. Perhaps you could place that list in vour Bible and when new names come add to your 'cloud of witnesses'.



Then Hebrews urges three responses: Let us get rid of anything that holds us back... Let us run with determination the race that lies before us... Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus. Each is essential to completing the race. After all, you cannot easily run if you laden down with heavy clothing, or if you are looking backwards or without a clear focus!

A member of my church in London came back injured from a skiing trip. She had hit a tree. I asked her, 'Why did you hit the tree? She replied, 'Because I was looking at the tree rather than the gap between the trees!' You may know a similar experience when driving on a motorway. Something gains your attention and slowly the car veers in that direction. What we look at invariably determines the direction of our travel which is before us. So the writer of Hebrews encouraged his readers to run with their eves fixed on Jesus. In my experience that is still good advice and when churches do that, they don't go far wrong.



During these weeks and months ahead all our churches have real mission opportunities. But we also face tough decisions. But let's be encouraged! We have a great cloud of witnesses cheering us on and their courageous examples can really help us. And as we journey through the stages of lockdown, may we continue to run the race of faith with our eyes fixed on Jesus. He is with us every step of the way.
