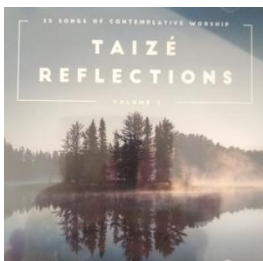
LONG SERVICE AWARDS TO LOCAL PREACHERS

KAIROS ARTS



Rev Sonia was inspired by the mission of Kairos Arts, based at Ruby Ferguson House at the back of the SHMC. Naomi Bidmead described the work being done to restore hope, dignity and self-worth – either through bespoke therapeutic arts workshops locally or the sale of ethical, handmade products helping artisans affected by poverty, exploitation, human trafficking and prostitution in India and Bolivia.

Rev Sonia wished to *“convey her deep appreciation to the Jersey Circuit for making her trip so memorable.”*

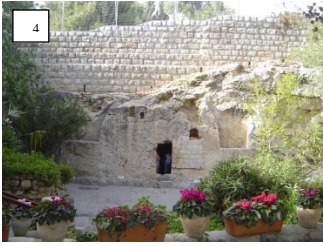
VISIT TO THE HOLY LAND

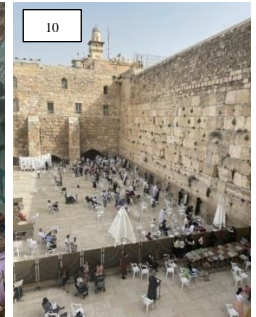
We were nineteen in number – 2 from England, 3 from Scotland (including John Perkins!) and 14 from various churches in Jersey. We had a wonderful orthodox Jewish guide called Yaakov, who had made aliyah to Israel approximately 30 years ago. We spent 5 days in Jerusalem and then moved on to Tiberias in Galilee for the next 5 days. As Israel had only recently opened up to tourists, we were blessed with very few crowds and, quite often, had places to ourselves, which is unprecedented and will probably never be repeated!

2. View of the Temple Mount from inside the Chapel of Dominus Flevit. This was where Jesus wept over the city of Jerusalem. Here we were privileged to sing before another group came in.
